A little Light Reading

I'm not exactly sure what inspired me to do it, but I recently read, and then re-read the following:

Storm Tactics – Lin and Larry Pardey

Adlard Coles' Heavy Weather Sailing – Peter Bruce

Sailing a Serious Ocean: Sail boats , Storms and Lessons Learned from 30 Years at Sea – John Kretschmer

Solitaire Spirit: Three Times Around the World Single-Handed – Les Powles

and lastly, Victor Shanes Drag Device Database by Noel Swanson.

I wasn't really scared until I read that last one. It's a litany of storms, hurricanes, rogue waves, capsizes and pitchpoles that made me wonder what \$4.29 piece of hardware I had that was going to fail at precisely the wrong time thereby turning my own world upside down (literally and figuratively – there's a story in Swanson's book about three New Zealanders living in their capsized trimaran for 118 days).

When I re-read the lot, I was looking for some common-threads among the many different, almost always, harrowing experiences that I was vicariously living. It didn't take long to find them. Once I knew where to look, I began to find them everywhere.

Like most things we experience away from the dock, what I found was elemental . Better yet, it was simple, easy to understand and inexpensive. In other words, it was within easy reach of anyone willing to cast off and turn their backs on the shore.

What separated the disasters from the near misses, the truly terrifying from the simply uncomfortable was preparation. Some of the sailors, power boaters and fisherman were simply better prepared than others. They had practiced heaving to, deploying drogues and sea-anchors, rigging up bridles and warps before the ultimate test. They had practiced these things, and more, on flat water under sunny skies before Neptune decided to put them to the ultimate test.

Those that had suffered the most were barely, or not at all, prepared. The time to learn is not when your life is on the line.

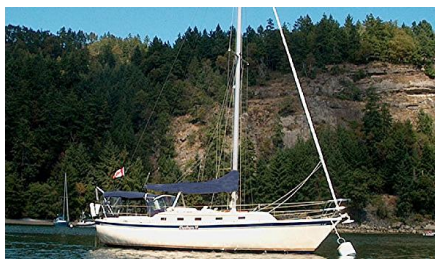

I believe the lesson here is simple. The better prepared we are, the better the outcome. The outcome doesn't have to be surviving the ultimate storm. The outcome can be simply getting off the dock in one piece. I can honestly say that because I have tried to leave the dock while still attached to it. The boat and/or dock was saved from my lack of preparation by a by-stander's willingness to risk injury by untying the offending spring-line in double-quick time.

You can be better prepared to leave the dock. To arrive back at the dock. To anchor. To reef. To refuel. To navigate. To stand watch. To go aloft. To tie that watcha-ma-doodle knot that takes the strain off a jammed winch. In short, there's an endless parade of opportunities to be better prepared for.

Make it a habit. Take ten seconds before you undertake anything and ask yourself if you're prepared. That simple habit will someday pay dividends that you, and Neptune himself can only imagine.
